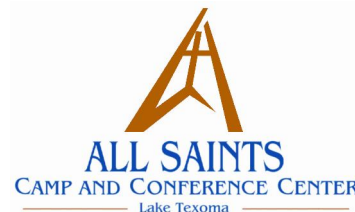


## All Saints Camp and Conference Center Summer Camp General Information



### HOW DO I REGISTER MY CHILD FOR CAMP?

### WHAT IS YOUR REFUND AND TRANSFER POLICY?

1. The deposit of \$100 is nonrefundable.

### WHAT IS THE RATIO OF CHILDREN TO COUNSELORS?

Our overall adult staff to camper ratio is 6 to 1, but it also depends upon that specific day. Each camper will be in a specific Camper Group for the Entire week or half week. We have no more than 12 campers with a counselor at any time. Group sizes will vary depending upon the nature of activities and age of the campers.

### WILL THE CHILDREN BE WITH THE SAME COUNSELOR OR GROUP THE ENTIRE SUMMER?

Campers will be with the same cabin counselors in their cabins and at meals. Campers will be with various programming staff (archery, Swimming, High Ropes) each activity session.

### ARE THE CHILDREN GROUPED ACCORDING TO GENDER AND AGE?

Cabin groups will be organized according to gender and age. During some programs and Christian education, several cabin groups will be together.

### WHAT IS THE SUPERVISION LIKE AT THE LAKE?

During swimming activities, lifeguard ration is 1:10, for boating it is 1:15.

### WHAT TYPE OF MEALS ARE SERVED TO THE CHILDREN?

Our Dining Hall serves a hot meal and fruit/salad bar at breakfast, lunch, and dinner. We also offer vegetarian options and can serve groups with special dietary needs with advanced notice.

### ARE THERE ANY EMERGENCY PROCEDURES FOR FIRE, EARTHQUAKES, ETC.?

We have designated campus wide evacuation plans depending on the nature of the emergency. All staff are trained and briefed on campus evacuation areas and emergency scenarios.

## **MAJOR CAMPER INJURIES?**

Most staff members are certified in CPR and First Aid. We also have first aid kits and AED machines that are throughout the camp. Preston EMS and Texoma Medical Center (Denison, Texas) are our emergency service providers.

## **WHAT IS YOUR POLICY REGARDING CAMPER MEDICINE?**

Each child is responsible for turning in its medications to the Health Officer upon arrival to camp. Similarly they must pick up their medications before departure. The Camp Health Officer will keep and administer all medications.

## **HOW IS THE STAFF SCREENED FOR EMPLOYMENT? HOW ARE THEY TRAINED?**

We have an intense selection process and a mandatory training session that allows us to choose and train the most highly qualified candidates. We look for responsible counselors who fit our active profile requirements. All counselors/staff had a background screening and safe church training.

## **WHO'S IN CHARGE OF THE COUNSELING STAFF?**

The Executive Director of All Saints Camp, The Missioner for Youth for the Diocese of Dallas, and the Summer Camp Chaplain are in charge of the Counseling Staff.

## **CAN MY CAMPER REQUEST A BUNKMATE?**

Bunkmate requests were made at the time of registration, any changes or updates should be mailed to: [info@allsaintstexoma.org](mailto:info@allsaintstexoma.org). Include the name of all campers that wish to bunk in the same cabin and the week of camp they are attending.

## **WHAT ARE THE DROP OFF AND PICK UP PROCEDURES?**

Campers need to be dropped off the first day of camp (typically a Sunday) at 12:30. Each camper must have a completed Camper Health Form and Camper Form ready to turn in at that time, PLEASE DO NOT MAIL THEM AHEAD. Campers will go through a Health Screening and all medications must be turned in to the Health Officer at that time.

Campers need to be picked up the last day of camp (typically a Saturday) at 11:00am. All families and friends are welcome to come to the Closing Celebrations on the final day of camp at 10:00am. All medications need to be picked up at that time, medications and/or left belongings WILL NOT BE MAILED.

## **HOW DO I GET TO ALL SAINTS?**

The Physical Address is: 418 Stanton Way, Pottsboro, TX 75076.

- From HWY 75 (also known as Central Expressway) take Exit 69 (the road is called both Morton Street and HWY 120)
- Head west toward Pottsboro
- Stay in left lane through Pottsboro (you will pass the High School, Middle School, Sonic Drive In)
- You will come to a turn-a-bout, proceed straight to the STOP SIGN and continue on HWY 120W (the Post Office should remain on your left)
- Continue to another stop sign at HWY 289, cross over and remain on HWY 120W for 5.5 miles, this road turns into Cooks Corner Road.  
(NOTE: You will pass a Church of Christ, HWY 289, St. John's Episcopal Church, and then another Church of Christ (the second one is very close to the Locust Road turn))
- Turn left at on to Locust Road and continue 2.2 miles (there is an All Saints WHITE and BLUE sign at this turn)
- At the only STOP SIGN, turn right on Mill Creek Road (Note the small grocery/gas station in front of you)
- All Saints gate is ½ mile on right, look for the giant orange colored "A's"
